





NOTICE OF TORT CLAIM

This claim is filed pursuant to the Nebraska Political Subdivision Tort Claims Act.

On or about April 6, 2021, Ms. Brooke Koch was savagely murdered by her estranged partner, Jason Arnold, in rural Gage County, Nebraska. Mr. Arnold had a history of threatening Ms. Koch with violence. Indeed, he had previously been charged with criminal offenses by the Gage County Attorney, Roger Harris; he was ultimately permitted to enroll in diversion for said offenses.

After being permitted to enroll in diversion for his first round of criminal offenses, Mr. Arnold again victimized Ms. Koch. He was again charged with criminal offenses. Mr. Arnold was arrested and his bond was established at \$50,000.00, with 10 % permitted for release. His mother expeditiously posted that amount, and Mr. Arnold was released.

Because of his new charges, Mr. Arnold was terminated from diversion. Despite his termination from diversion unsuccessfully, however, Gage County Attorney Roger Harris never refiled the charges against Mr. Arnold for which he was originally permitted to enroll in diversion. Apparently, Harris simply gave him a "pass" on those charges. Indeed, had Harris refiled those charges against Mr. Arnold, Mr. Arnold's bond would have been set at an extremely high amount, making it difficult – if not impossible – for Mr. Arnold to post. It would have been nearly impossible for Mr. Arnold to murder Brooke under these circumstances.

Overall, the Bike Trail Enhancement Project aims to enhance the city of Beatrice's robust trail system with the installation of eight bike repair stations along with trail signage including trail maps. The bike repair stations each include an air pump and multiple tools on cables that can be used to make basic repairs to bicycles such as changing a flat to adjusting brakes and derailleurs. Currently, there are no bike repair stations within city limits.

In addition to the bike repair stations, we would like to add additional 3x6ft "Welcome To Beatrice Trails" sign with donor recognition for the project. We would also like to include a map of the trails on the back of the sign. Maps are used by trail users to plan routes, estimate travel times, and track their progress. There is a current need for a map, especially for out of town visitors, and we would like to solve that issue.

21. How will this project contribute to the current tourism inventory?

The Beatrice Trail System is a popular tourist attraction for out-of-town visitors. The addition of bike repair stations provides cyclists a way to repair their bicycles away from home. This is crucial for overnight visitors, making our trail system with repairs stations installed a more realistic and safe option for travelers. Signage and trail maps are both additions that make the trails easier to utilize if you are not familiar with current routes. For visitors, being familiar with the trails is important for safety reasons. This would be a solution to the current lack thereof. Increased visitation to the area also increases sales at local restaurants, hotels, and shops. This would be a positive for not just Gage County Tourism, but the local business community as well.

22. Who is the target market for this project?

There is a multigenerational market of visitors for this project as trails users are various ages. The trail is used for multiple events throughout the year, making visitors, bicyclists, and runners the target market for this project.

While there is no way to gather an accurate number of annual visitors, the trail system is utilized for multiple biking and running events throughout the year. Including the Golden ride that has an anticipated 350-500 participants in 2022.



As past president of the Homestead Conservation and Trails Association (HCTA) and of the Big Blue Cycling Club (BBBC), I have seen firsthand the benefits of trail improvement in the Beatrice and Gage County areas.

The Beatrice Leadership 2021/2022 team is taking on a project that has been talked about and reviewed for a number of years. I'm so glad action is being taken to install the maps along the trail as well as bike repair stations. We hear from quite a few trail users that it is hard to navigate their way from The Homestead Trail to the Chief Standing Bear Trail. The maps will incorporate a nice way for out of town visitors to explore our trail system as well as the City of Beatrice.

Chief Standing Bear Trail is adding bike repair stations with the help of a private donor. One has been installed at the Blue Springs Trailhead and the 2nd will be installed this spring at the Holmesville Trailhead. Plans are in the process to install a 3rd bike repair station at the Barneston Trailhead. These repair stations are a great aid to cyclists on the more remote areas of the trail.

With the completion of the trail system connecting the Homestead Trail to the Chief Standing Bear Trail, cyclists are able to ride the trail system from Lincoln all the way to Marysville, KS. The trail transitions from the Homestead to the Chief Standing Bear trail in Beatrice. The Map system and bike repair stations will greatly enhance the rider experience on the trail system.

HCTA and BBBC have hosted numerous events on the trail system that draws a number of out of town guests. Word of mouth spreads and guests usually make their way back to our area to explore more of the trail systems.

I applaud the Beatrice Leadership Team 2021/2022 in this great endeavor to enhance and promote physical activity in our beautiful outdoors.



PUBLIC ENTITIES MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into on April _____. 2022, by and among the undersigned Village/City/County ("Governing Body"), Public Power Provider, a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("Public Power Provider"), and the Nebraska Public Power District, a public corporation and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska ("NPPD") (each a "Partner" and collectively, the "Partners") with regard to cooperation in seeking and utilizing local, state, and federal funding for the deployment of Broadband¹ infrastructure in the service area(s) described below (the "Project Area(s)) (collectively, the "Project").

RECITALS

- A. The Partners hereby acknowledge and endorse the following principles regarding access to reliable and affordable, "Broadband":
 - Broadband access is critical to attracting and retaining a vital and talented workforce in Nebraska.
 - 2. Broadband access is critical to the success of the Nebraska agricultural industry and other industries competing in the global marketplace.
 - 3. Public Power Provider(s), and NPPD, recognize that Broadband access is critical to grid modernization and optimization.
 - 4. Governing Bodies recognize that Broadband access is critical to the development and provision of essential social services, community development initiatives, education, medical services, public safety, and other basic services.
 - 5. All sectors of the State should work together to rapidly deploy Broadband infrastructure throughout the State of Nebraska, including the Project Area.
 - Governing Bodies and Public Power Partners have a demonstrated record of constructing and maintaining vital long-term infrastructure necessary to provide access to services in rural areas.
 - 7. Private providers of Broadband ("Private Provider"), which operate in the highly competitive and rapidly evolving telecommunications industry, are well-versed at engaging in sales and marketing, handling customer service, and adapting to changing technologies and customer preferences for technology-based services.

¹ "Broadband" is the transmission of wide bandwidth data over a high-speed internet connection with systemic speed of a minimum of 100/100 Mbps.

8. Cooperation and collaboration between and among Governing Bodies, Public Power Providers, NPPD and Private Providers is essential to the development and deployment of Broadband services in rural areas of Nebraska.

B. In connection with the development of the Project(s), the Partners hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Partners will cooperate and collaborate in good faith to develop a structure for the ownership, construction, operation and maintenance of Broadband infrastructure which will serve the needs of **all** locations and consumers in the Project Area(s), including but not limited to:
 - a. Establishment of contractual arrangements for efficient administrative processes.
 - b. Development of agreements for use of facilities and dark fiber consistent with cost-sharing arrangements developed for infrastructure deployment, maintenance, and operations.
 - c. Arrangements for cost recovery, debt service, and maintenance costs for deployment of Broadband infrastructure.
 - d. Development of simplified, efficient and cost-effective processes for access to facilities for collocation, pole attachments, easements and permits.
 - e. Development of integrated agreements with Private Providers for construction of facilities necessary for access, delivery, and maintenance of Broadband services to consumers throughout the Project Area(s).
- 2. The Partners agree to collaborate to secure funding for the Project through all available private and public (local, state, and federal) funding sources and programs, including philanthropic funds and private equity.
- 3. The Partners will cooperate to promptly assemble, marshal and share all relevant information, resources and documentation necessary to secure relevant funding for the Project(s).
- 4. The Partners agree to use their best efforts to develop effective public-private partnerships designed to drive the deployment of Broadband to unserved and underserved area of the State of Nebraska.
- 5. The Partners will seek out and evaluate potential Private Providers that could provide Broadband service that complies with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.

- 6. The Partners will require delivery of minimum levels of service by Private Providers in order to retain access to and use of the Partner's Broadband infrastructure, including fiber.
- 7. The Partners will further develop contractual arrangements for the efficient and timely completion of the Project(s), including project deadlines, milestones, reporting requirements, speed tests, standards and techniques, and other reasonable measures to assure accountability.

C. Allocation of Funding:

The Partners will use their best efforts to equitably allocate all funding awards or proceeds between and among the Partners to facilitate the deployment of the Broadband infrastructure for the Project in the most reasonable and efficient manner possible.
